Vernon, N.Y., Oct 17, 1862; merchant; Madison until 1862; since Deansboro, N.Y.; Republican: member Brothertown Tent 514, K. O. T. M. In early life he was a school teacher in Eaton and Augusta, N.Y., afterwards druggist in Deansboro. He is a composer of vocal and instrumental music, and has been an instructor and conductor of musical societies; she Meth.
